If you want to help underwrite the event and see your business recognized as one of the sponsors here's how you can get involved:

Speaker Sponsor (15 available at this level): \$500. This sponsorship helps pay for the cost of speaker travel, housing, and food. The speakers are not paid to speak, but sometimes they incur travel and miscellaneous expenses for which we reimburse them. You can pick a speaker you would like to sponsor or let us choose one for you. The name of your business will be featured in the TEDxSpokane program, on the Sponsor Slide in the theater during the program, on any printed advertising and on the TEDxSpokane website. Signage throughout the event will also recognize your business for sponsoring the conference. You will also be given the opportunity to set up a table the day of the event (including two tickets to the TEDxSpokane conference) and include items in the "swag" bag given to each attendee. Additionally, you will be invited to post-function events to meet with all of the speakers at the Davenport House on the Saint George's campus.

TEDxSpokane Sponsor (3 available at this level): \$1500. This sponsorship helps to pay for costs associated with marketing, advertising, venue signage, and any additional electronic rentals associated with the production of TEDxSpokane. This is a non-profit venture run by volunteers to bring and share ideas in the Spokane Community. The name of your business will be featured in the TEDxSpokane program, on the Sponsor Slide in the theater during the program, on any printed advertising and on the TEDxSpokane website. Signage throughout the event will also recognize your business for sponsoring the conference. You will also be given the opportunity to set up a table the day of the event (including **four** tickets to the TEDxSpokane conference) and include items in the "swag" bag given to each attendee. Additionally, you will be invited to post-function events to meet with all of the speakers at the Davenport House on the Saint George's campus.

An Idea Worth Sharing Sponsor (1 available at this level): \$3,500. This sponsorship is designed to assure the attendees and speakers that we are committed to develop the best TEDx conference for Spokane. We are required to video each talk and post it to the TEDx YouTube site with the potential that it will be selected for the TED.com. TED videos reach millions of people! (Each time a TEDxSpokane 2014 video is seen your company name and logo will appear at the beginning and end of each talk.)
